1. What issue is being addressed?

It is necessary to notify the provisions contained in Chapter 3b on the marketing and labelling of beverages with added caffeine or taurine and Chapter 4a on penal provisions in the Public Health Act of 11 September 2015 (Journal of Laws [Dziennik Ustaw] of 2024, item 1670). The Act of 17 August 2023 amending the Public Health Act and certain other acts (Journal of Laws, item 1718), which introduced the above provisions, required notification at the level of the World Trade Organisation (WTO) and the European Commission, to which the Ministry of Health drew the attention of the Sejm of the Republic of Poland [lower house of the Polish Parliament] during the drafting process. Despite this, no such notification has been made. The draft was not notified to the European Commission nor was it notified at the WTO level. In the course of the work on the Act, objections to the proposed provisions were formally reported by the administrations of the United Kingdom (UK) and the United States of America (USA) (through the World Trade Organisation's contact points for Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT WTO) to the Polish WTO TBT contact point at the Polish Committee for Standardisation [PKN]), and informally raised by the Swiss administration in communication with the Permanent Mission of the Republic of Poland to the WTO. As these concerns relate to technical issues in trade and the introduction of, inter alia, a marketing ban and labelling requirements, which may have an impact on international trade, the above-mentioned countries have requested the administration of the Republic of Poland to make an appropriate notification at the WTO level, within the framework of the Committee on Technical Barriers to Trade (TBT), so that comments could be made. According to the procedures adopted under the WTO's TBT rules, matters such as product labelling requirements are regarded as technical requirements for trade. In addition, the USA has requested the removal of the ban on the sale of energy drinks to persons under the age of 18 and the general ban on the sale of energy drinks in vending machines to persons of all ages. In terms of labelling, the USA took the view that member companies of the International Council of Beverage Associations are obliged to act responsibly and not to promote or suggest excessive or irresponsible consumption of energy drinks. The UK, in turn, on 24 May 2024, raised concerns about the mere fact of nonnotification and pointed out that the main problem was that companies had not been given enough time to adapt to the new requirements during the implementation of the rules. The UK requested the Republic of Poland to suspend the implementation of these measures in order to facilitate the notification in accordance with the required procedure and to allow time for consideration of the comments and any subsequent amendments. It should be pointed out that if the above-mentioned notification is not carried out, a risk exists that these countries may initiate a trade dispute against the Republic of Poland as part of the proceedings of the WTO's TBT Committee.

Moreover, failure to notify the provisions currently prevents proceedings from being conducted on the basis of those provisions and courts deem there is no need to adjudicate on the initiated proceedings, citing the relevant case-law of the Court of Justice of the European Union. The criminal provisions repealed in the draft act cannot be used as the basis for conducting criminal proceedings and proceedings in offence cases, since they have not been notified to the European Commission. The notification will effectively enable the carrying out of appropriate criminal proceedings and proceedings in offence cases due to noncompliance with the provisions of the Act.

Initially, as a result of the notification, no change in the wording of the provisions is expected, but ultimately this will depend on the nature of the comments made and the possible presentation of new scientific data.

2. The recommended solution, including planned intervention tools and expected impact

The draft Act amending the Public Health Act is technical in nature. The Public Health Act of 11 September 2015 repeals the provisions of Chapter 3b on the marketing and labelling of beverages with added caffeine or taurine and of Chapter 4a on penal provisions and introduces them, with identical wording, in the proposed Chapter 3c and Chapter 4b. This will allow for TBT notifications to the WTO and to the European Commission. This will serve the purpose of transparency in the adoption of regulations by the Republic of Poland as a member of the WTO, as well as will testify to the willingness of the Polish administration to co-operate with the European Commission and individual WTO countries in order to clarify the existing doubts regarding the introduced regulations. Moreover, the notification will effectively enable the carrying out of appropriate criminal proceedings and proceedings in offence cases due to non-compliance with the provisions of the Act (currently, proceedings are discontinued due to failure to notify the provisions).

3. How has this problem been solved in other countries, in particular OECD/EU Member States?

The arrangements in force in other countries are unrelated to the subject matter of the draft Act.
