
8. The Future of Media Commission (FOMC) was established by the Irish Government in 2020 as an

independent body to consider the future of print, broadcast, and online media in a platform-agnostic fashion. The report of the FOMC, published in July 2022, recommended that the non-broadcast activities of Ireland's PSM providers, RTÉ and TG4, be subject to regulatory control.

The General Scheme of the Broadcasting (Amendment) Bill was approved by the Irish Government on 8 April 2025. Head 27 of the General Scheme aims to extend the current codes, duties and rules that apply to audiovisual and sound programmes broadcast by regulated broadcasters and video-on-demand providers to all content published by Ireland's PSM providers.

9. Part 3B of the Irish Broadcasting Act 2009 sets out the duties, codes and rules applying to audiovisual broadcasting services, sound broadcasting services and video-on-demand services established or, where applicable, licenced in Ireland. The duties, code and rules give effect to relevant provisions of Directive 2010/13/EU which apply to audiovisual broadcasting and video-on-demand services. Certain types of programming, namely sound programming which available over the internet, and written content are currently not subject to statutory content regulation.

Given the specific position of the two Irish public service media providers, RTÉ and TG4, it is considered appropriate to apply elements of those duties, codes and rules which apply to broadcast content to all non-broadcast content made available by the public service media providers. This is to ensure a consistency of regulation of content made available by the public service media providers and to allow the public the ability to make complaints to the independent Irish media regulator, Coimisiún na Meán, regarding all content made available by the public service media providers.
